AWARD OF BRONZE STAR

Under the provisions of AR 600-45 and Section I Circular 6, Third United States Army, current series, the Bronze Star is awarded to:

JAMES M. KNOUF, 0329799, Major, Infantry, United States Army, for heroic achievement in connection with military operations against the enemy in France on 12 June 1944. Entered Military Service from Iowa.

HUBERT E. JACKSON, 0312989, Captain, Infantry, United States Army, for heroic achievement in connection with military operations against the enemy in France on 8 September 1944. Entered Military Service from California.

HUGO H. PYES, 0376620, Captain (then First Lieutenant) Infantry, United States Army, for heroic service in connection with military operations against the enemy in France during the period 8 June to 22 August 1944. Entered Military Service from North Dakota.

HUGH F. CAMPBELL, 38001292, Technical Sergeant, Infantry, United States Army, for heroic service in connection with military operations against the enemy in France during the period 8 June to 22 September 1944. Entered Military Service from Arizona.

CARL M. CRONRATH, 33073773, Staff Sergeant, Infantry, United States Army, for heroic achievement in connection with military operations against the enemy in France on 19 August 1944. Entered Military Service from Pennsylvania.

EDWIN C. PETERSON, 37155915, Technician Fifth Grade, Infantry, United States Army, for heroic achievement in connection with military operations against the enemy in France on 20 August 1944. Entered Military Service from Wyoming.

DURWOOD G. BEST, 37677229, Private First Class, Infantry, United States Army, for heroic achievement in connection with military operations against the enemy in France on 8 September 1944. Entered Military Service from Iowa.


