(Sec V Award of Bronze Star GO 218 Hq 90th Inf Div 17 Dec 44 contd)

JOHN P. CONCINA, 42030916, Private First Class, Infantry, 357th Infantry, United States Army. For heroic achievement in support of operations on 29 October 1944 in the vicinity of Maizieres les Metz, France. Private First Class Concina, Rifleman, preceding an advancing squad of Company **, 357th Infantry, encountered grenade fire from an entrenched enemy endeavoring to cover the escape of an enemy machine gun crew. With the aid of a companion, he routed the entrenched enemy and held the enemy gunners at bay until the squad arrived. This resulted in the destruction of the enemy fortification. His heroic achievement was in accordance with military tradition. Entered Military Service from New York.

LESTER B. DAVIS, 38102252, Private First Class, Infantry, 357th Infantry, United States Army. For heroic achievement in operations on 29 October 1944 in the vicinity of Maizieres les Metz, France. During the attack on the town, Private First Class Davis, Rifleman, with the aid of a companion, protected the right flank of their squad, despite the frequent fire of enemy snipers. In aiding materially in the success of the mission, he and his companion accounted for six of the enemy, killing two of them. His heroic achievement was in accordance with military tradition. Entered Military Service from Texas.

LELAND E. DeWALD, 37514851, Private First Class, Infantry, 357th Infantry, United States Army. For heroic achievement in operations on 29 October 1944 in the vicinity of Maizieres les Metz, France. During the attack on the town, Private First Class DeWALD, Rifleman, with the aid of a companion, used hand grenades so effectively that enemy troops were driven from one strongpoint and pinned down in two other positions. By his personal initiative, he aided materially in the successful assault of the town. His heroic achievement was in accordance with military tradition. Entered Military Service from Nebraska.

GILBERT L. HARDESTY, 35555135, Private First Class, Infantry, 357th Infantry, United States Army. For heroic achievement in operations on 17 November 1944 in the vicinity of Kedange, France. During the house-to-house fighting in the town, Private First Class Hardesty, Squad Leader, successfully led his squad against heavy enemy resistance. By means of his courageous and aggressive leadership, his Platoon advanced and removed all enemy resistance. His heroic achievement was in accordance with military tradition. Entered Military Service from Ohio.

GEORGE A. JOHNSTON, 36650215, Private First Class (Then Private), Infantry, 357th Infantry, United States Army. For heroic achievement in operations on 4 October 1944 in the vicinity of Maizieres les Metz, France. During an attack on a slag pile near the town, Company **, 357th Infantry, encountered heavy enemy resistance. Private First Class Johnston, Rifleman, and his companions, initiated an assault against the enemy which enabled the Company to attain its objective. His heroic achievement was in accordance with military tradition. Entered Military Service from Illinois.

RAYMOND M. MANTZEY, 37510614, Private First Class, Infantry, 357th Infantry, United States Army. For heroic achievement in operations on 29 October 1944 in the vicinity of Maizieres les Metz, France. During the attack on the town, Private First Class Mantzey, Rifleman, with the aid of a companion, protected the right flank of their squad, despite the frequent fire of enemy snipers. In aiding materially in the success of the mission, he and his companion accounted for six of the enemy, killing two of them. His heroic achievement was in accordance with military tradition. Entered Military Service from Missouri.

FRANCIS R. MURPHY, 38286020, Private First Class, Infantry, 357th Infantry, United States Army. For heroic achievement in operations on 4 October 1944 in the vicinity of Maizieres les Metz, France. Under the cover of darkness, a fierce enemy attack temporarily cut off Private First Class Murphy and five companions from their company. With the enemy on their front, left flank and rear, the small group courageously defended their position with grenades and rifle fire until dawn, when they counterattacked and forced the numerically superior enemy to withdraw. His heroic achievement was in accordance with military tradition. Entered Military Service from Texas.

RAYMOND E. SEACE, 31375085, Private First Class, Infantry, 357th Infantry, United States Army. For heroic service in support of operations against the enemy in France. On 29 October 1944, Private First Class Seace, Rifleman, distinguished himself in the performance of outstanding service. Throughout the attack, Private First Class Seace continually ran messages from the Forward Assault Echelons to the rear elements while subjected to direct enemy fire of various calibers. He was materially responsible for the maintenance of communications. His heroic service was in accordance with military tradition. Entered Military Service from New Hampshire.

HAROLD A. SMITH, 32851825, Private First Class, Infantry, 357th Infantry, United States Army. For heroic service in support of operations against the enemy in France. On 29 October 1944, Private First Class Smith distinguished himself in the performance of outstanding service. During the attack, Private First Class Smith was wounded twice. Having received first-aid, he continued to maintain communications with the rear elements by personally delivering messages on foot through areas under heavy enemy fire. His heroic service was in accordance with military tradition. Entered Military Service from New York.

JOSEPH L. TIVIERGE, 31215998, Private First Class (Then Private), Infantry, 357th Infantry, United States Army. For heroic service in support of operations against the enemy in France. During the period 5 July to 12 July 1944, Private Tivierge distinguished himself in the performance of outstanding service. As Driver, he made repeated trips to the front, hauling supplies and ammunition over a supply route under enemy observation and constantly covered by interdictionary artillery fire. Though the vehicle was pierced by shell fragments on several occasions, he, continued through the enemy fire and delivered ammunition to the front line troops. His heroic service was in accordance with military tradition. Entered Military Service from Canada.

JOSE A. WINTERS, 38104533, Private First Class, Infantry, 357th Infantry, United States Army. For heroic achievement in operations on 4 October 1944 in the vicinity of Maizieres les Metz, France. Under the cover of darkness, a fierce enemy attack temporarily cut off Private First Class Winters and five companions from their company. With the enemy on their front, left-flank and rear, the small group courageously defended their position with grenades and rifle fire until dawn, when they counterattacked and forced the numerically superior enemy to withdraw. His heroic achievement was in accordance with military tradition. Entered Military Service from Colorado.

NATHAN S. PAVEY, 35895261, Private, Infantry, 357th Infantry, United States Army. For heroic achievement in operations on 4 October 1944 in the vicinity of Maizieres les Metz, France. During an attack on a slag pile near the town, Company ****, 357th Infantry, encountered heavy enemy resistance. Private Pavey, Rifleman, and his companions, initiated an assault against the enemy which enabled the Company to attain its objective. His heroic achievement was in accordance with military tradition. Entered Military Service from Indiana.

NORMAN E. WORRELL, 35730157, Private, Infantry, 357th Infantry, United States Army. For heroic achievement in operations on 4 October 1944 in the vicinity of Maizieres les Metz, France. During an attack on a slag pile near the town, Company **, 357th Infantry, encountered heavy enemy resistance. Private Worrell, Rifleman, and his companions, initiated an assault against the enemy which enabled the Company to attain its objective. His heroic achievement was in accordance with military tradition. Entered Military Service from Indiana.

ARNOLD M. THOMPSON, 0339812, Captain, Infantry, 357th Infantry, United States Army, for meritorious service in connection with military operations against the enemy in France during the period 1 October to 1 November 1944. Entered Military Service from New Jersey.

HAROLD C. BRANAE, 01317879, First Lieutenant, Infantry, 357th Infantry, United States Army, for meritorious service in connection with military operations against the enemy in France during the period 8 June to 25 November 1944. Entered Military Service from Minnesota.
