AWARD OF THE PURPLE HEART By direction of the President and authority contained in AR 600-45, 22 September 1943, as amended, The Purple Heart is awarded to the following named Enlisted Men, United States Army, for wound received in action against the enemy in France, the date of award in each instance being the date of wound:
