SECTION I

1. General Orders No. 8, Headquarters 359th Infantry, July 27, 1942, is rescinded.

SECTION II

1. Pursuant to instructions issued in General Order No. 4 Hq. 90th Motorized Division, Camp Berkeley, Texas, March 27, 1942 and FM 26-5, the following regulations are prescribed for the Interior Guard of the 359th Infantry Regiment in safeguarding the public property and buildings in the regimental area as shown in annex No. 1 to General Order No. 4, Hq. 90th Motorized Division, as amended by letter Hq. 90th Division dated June 27, 1942, subject: Guard, Fire, and Police Area.

2. The following duties will be performed by the personnel of the guard in addition to those prescribed by FM 26-5:

Officer of the Day

a. The Officer of the Day will take reveille and retreat reports from the respective battalion Adjutants and Special Unit Commanders. This report will be taken from a post in front of the main entrance to the Regimental Recreation Hall.

b. The Officer of the Day will perform his regular duties during drill hours in addition to his duties as Officer of the Day.

Commander of the Guard

a. The Commander of the Guard will carefully instruct his guard as to the location of fire alarm boxes and the method of giving the fire alarm, and to proper method of using available fire extinguishers.

b. The Commander of the Guard will instruct his guard in all pertinent camp regulations and require that they be complied with.

c. He will instruct his guard that civilians will not be permitted in the regimental area, except on streets and in buildings open to the public, unless they have a written pass issued by the regimental Adjutant. Friends will be permitted to visit enlisted men in the company day rooms, but will not be allowed to enter tents except in the company of an officer.

d. He will not accept prisoners for confinement, but will give instructions that they be sent to the camp stockade accompanied by a written statement covering the prisoner's name, grade, serial number, organization, Article of War violated and a brief description of the offense.

e. He will instruct his guard that they will not arrest civilians, but if a civilian is guilty of any offense in violation of his special orders, he will be detained and the Provost Marshal notified immediately.

3. The posts of the guard are as follows:

Post No. 1. From 0730 to 1730 around the Motor Pool. (except on Sundays and Holidays)

Post No. 2. Daily from 1730 to 0730 around the East half of the Motor Pool. Sundays and holidays from 1730 to 1730 (24 hrs.)

Post No. 3. Daily from 1730 to 0730 around the West half of the Motor Pool. Sundays and holidays from 1730 to 1730 (24 hrs.)

Post No. 4. From 1730 to 0730 around the South half of the Regimental Area bounded by Pershing, Avenue G, 6th Street and Avenue H, including the RSO.

Post No. 5. From 0730 to 0730 around the North half of the Regtl. Area, bounded by Pershing, Avenue F, 6th Street and Avenue G.

Post No. 6. From 1830 to closing inside PX No. 5. Sundays and holidays from 1200 to closing.

4. Special Orders: Posts No. 1, 2, and 3

1. To allow no vehicles to be removed from the Motor Pool except through the main entrance to the pool.

2. To allow no one to loiter in the vicinity of the Motor Pool.

3. To check all vehicles to see that the keys are in the switches

4. To allow no one to remove any property from vehicles or the Motor Pool without authority from the Commanding Officer, the Transportation Officer, the Supply Officer or the unit commander of the unit to which the vehicle is assigned.

5. In case of fire, to notify the dispatch office immediately and to attempt to extinguish the fire.

Post No. 4.

1. In case of Fire to awaken the occupants of the building then proceed to nearest fire alarm box and give the alarm.

2. To allow no loitering.

3. To try the doors on the RSO each time around and allow no one except authorized personnel to remove any property.

Post No. 5.

1. In case of Fire to awaken the occupants of the building then proceed to the nearest fire alarm box and give the alarm.

Post No. 6.

1. To allow no one to enter except in proper uniform.

2. To allow no one to throw refuse on the floor.

3. To allow no unsoldierly conduct upon the part of anyone.

The Alert Guard will consist of two (2) NCO's and Six (6) Privates from each battalion. They will report to the Personnel Officer at the Regtl. Recreation Bldg. Immediately upon announcement of an Alert by Regt. or two (2) hours prior to departure of the Regt. on Field Problems.

6. The Guard will be posted as directed in paragraphs 9 and 24 of FM 26-5. Reliefs will be of two (2) hours duration.

7. Daily (except Sundays & Holidays) the Corporals of the Guard and Sentinels for Posts No. 2, 3, 4, 5, & 6 will be on duty with their organization from 0730 to 1700.

8. No compensating time will be given upon relief from Guard.
