I. GENERAL ORDER NUMBER 73, this Headquarters, 1 June 1945, and Supplemental Guard Orders 1, 2, 3 and 4, are rescinded.

Partially 24 July 45 - 08.

II. OFFICER OF THE DAY.

(a) Officer of the Day will remain in the Guard House at all times except when carrying out his official duty. Either the Officer of the Day or Sergeant of the Guard will be in the Guardhouse at all times.

(b) Officer of the Day will take a bed-check of one company each night after curfew hour. This check will be made between the hours of 2330-0030. Companies will not be notified in advance. Officer of the Day may check any company he desires.

(c) Officer of the Day will check the Guard once (1) before midnight and twice (2) after midnight. Each relief will be checked at least once during its tour of duty.

(d) Officer of the Day will turn in to the Regimental Adjutant each morning the name, rank, ASN, and organization of each enlisted man who enters the Post after curfew hour.

(e) Officer of the Day will make an inspection of the area each day between the hours of 1000-1200. DAILY INSPECTION REPORT will be turned in to the Regimental Adjutant each day at 1300.

III. COMMANDER OF THE GUARD.

(a) Commander of the Guard is responsible for the instruction, discipline, and performance of duty of the guard.

(b) He will see that all members of the guard are correctly instructed in their orders and duties and that they understand and properly perform them.

(c) He will check the guard at least twice (2) before midnight and once (1) after midnight. Each relief will be checked at least once during its tour of duty.

(d) He will inspect the guardhouse and cells each morning before the prisoners are let out to work and insure that they are properly policed.

(e) He will form the guard as soon as practicable when an alarm is raised.

(f) He will cause the detail for raising and lowering the flag at reveille and retreat to be made in time for the proper performance of this duty. He will see that the flags are never handled except in the performance of duty.

(g) He will see that all sentinels are relieved at the proper time.

(h) The Commander of the Guard will detain at the guardhouse all suspicious looking persons or parties moving about without authority. He will report the circumstances to the Officer of the Day who will decide what action is to be taken.

(i) He is responsible for the ~~control~~ of the prisoners under charge of the guard. When any go to the guardhouse for confinement, the Command will cause him to be searched for any unauthorized possession. He will report the fact of confinement to the Officer of the Day.

(j) He will prepare the guard roll daily to the Officer of the Day.
